“First Years for Families” (FYFF) is a Home Visitation program funded by Alberta Children’s Services as a program under the Greater Foothills Family Resource Network. The Family Support Worker visits with the family in their home to help expectant parents and those with newborns and young children. Knowing about infant care and understanding how to help little ones grow and develop is important work for parents in the *first 5 years*.

FYFF supports families to improve their parenting skills and provide a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment for their children.

The overall goal is to give their children a healthy start during these critical years to increase the opportunities for reaching their full potential. Supports can be available to the family until the child reaches 6 years.

- Weekly visits in the family’s home.
- Learn about parenting skills and how to provide a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment for their children.
- Family Support Workers connect parents with other community resources as well counselling supports if needed.
