Rules and Regulations

1. Entry fee of \$5.00 per family.
2. All exhibits should be entered the night before the show between 5:00 pm and 8:00pm. Home cooking may also be entered between 9:00am and 10:00am on the day of the show.
3. Doors open at 2:00 pm for viewing.
4. If no competition exists and an article or exhibit is not worthy of the first prize, the judges may award second, third, or none.
- 5. A class may be subdivided if exhibits are numerous**
6. Open Class is meant for those entries which do not fit in any other category in that section.
7. No entries shall be removed from the display until 7:00pm on the day of the show. Official entry tags must be on all exhibits. Tags will be available prior to the Fair Day in local businesses.
8. Ribbons will be given in each section.
9. Point system will be used in judging. Points are awarded to the first (3 Points), second (2 points), third (1 point).
10. The most points in each section receives an award.
11. An award will be presented to the entrant with the highest overall points.
12. Articles for judging must be entered under the name of the person who made them; otherwise, enter for display only.
13. Articles may only be entered for ONE YEAR.
14. The Fall Fair committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
15. Please pick up Fair money after 7:00pm, all monies not collected Fair night will go to the Fair Board.
16. Ribbons may be returned to be recycled.
17. \$1.00 per point, prize money can be picked up at the registration table.

Sample Tag

Section A **Needlecraft & Open**

Class No. 1

Needlework: Open submissions, submit as many articles as you want, as long as there are no duplicates ie trying to submit two Needlepoint.

Examples of Needlework: Needlepoint, Embroidery, Wall Hangings, Counted cross-stitch, Bunka, Chicken Scratch, Hooked Articles, Hardanger, Chicken scratch, Candle Wicking, Bargello.

Class No. 2

Crocheting: Open submissions, submit as many articles as you want, as long as there are no duplicates ie trying to submit two Doilies.

Examples of Crocheting: Doily, crochet baby set, crochet garment, tablecloth, bedspread, tea cozie, flowers, any stuffed toy, and cushion and Afghans. One child and one baby sweater are allowed.

Class No. 3

Knitting: Open submissions, submit as many articles as you want, as long as there are no duplicates ie trying to submit two tablecloths.

Examples of Knitting: Doily, hand sweater, baby set, garment, bulky knit sweater, doll clothes, any stuffed toy, tablecloth, bedspread, cushion, and afghans.

Class No. 4

Quilts: Open, identify method of quilting on entry tag.

Example of Quilts: Tied quilt, hand stitched quilt, machine stitched quilt, appliqued quilt, and baby quilt.

Class No. 5

Open: this class is for anything that doesn't fall under the other needlecraft and sewing categories.

Examples of Open: rugs, cushions, accessories, belts, purses, and hair adornments.

Judging Standards for Vegetables and Fruit

Color: Should be bright, clear, attractive. In vegetables a dark rich color is preferred

Condition: Produce free from blemishes from insect, disease, or mechanical damage to the best of your ability

Quality: High quality

Size: Moderate not large

Trueness to Type: To be as close to optimal as possible for the specific kind of produce

Grain and Forage

1 pint clear jar of grain

Grain must have grown in current crop year or last year

Cleaned by hand or elevator

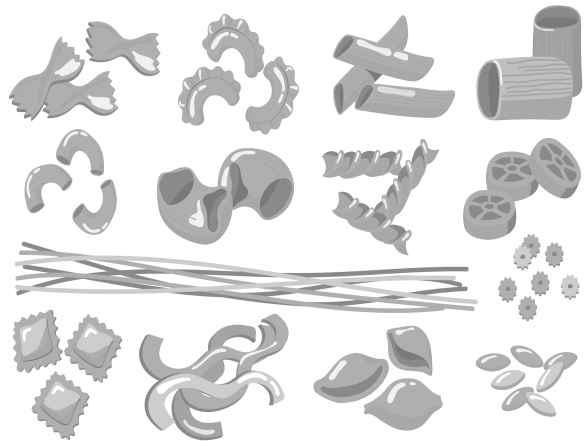
